Chances are that in the past week you've received an e-mail in your

inbox that pretends to be from your bank, e-commerce vendor, or

other on-line site. Hopefully you've realized that many times this e-

mail is fake - a phishing e-mail. The sender (phisher) of these fake e-

mails wants you to click on the link in the e-mail and go to a phishing

Web site which will look just like the Web site of the company being

phished. Once on the phishers Web site they hope to obtain your

account, financial, credit and even identity information. Of course not

every e-mail you receive is a phish. In fact you should expect your

bank or e-commerce vendor to send you legitimate e-mail.

legitimate Web site or e-mail and one that's a phishing attempt?
